
BCH's Injury Prevention Program, part of their Trauma Center, is dedicated to dramatically decreasing the number of preventable injuries through research and public education.

Since 2017, Fundación MAPFRE has partnered with BCH's Injury Prevention Program, building the "Safe Play Starts Here" program with the goal of educating the community to take measures to prevent injuries, especially injuries sustained by children, in their homes. Health educators travel in the Injury Prevention Van, holding workshops throughout Massachusetts and teaching how to avoid unintentional injuries.

Thanks to Fundación MAPFRE support, BCH Injury Prevention team expanded their community education across the state.

Fundación MAPFRE and UMass Memorial Injury Prevention Center partnered to create Safety Quest, an innovative mobile classroom delivered to schools and community events in Massachusetts. Safety Quest teaches middle school students how to be safe. The students learn how to ensure their own safety while becoming injury prevention advocates with their peers and family.

Fundación MAPFRE's collaboration with UMass Memorial Medical Center is expected to reach more than 3,000 children in central Massachusetts during the 2023–2024 school year.



Mothers Against Drunk Driving

Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) knows that the hopes for a safer future are riding on tomorrow's drivers. By getting today's youth off to a good start, they are taking a step toward fulfilling their vision of a nation without drunk driving. MADD is focused on tackling underage drinking, a problem that threatens the safety of kids and endangers entire communities, now and down the road. MADD is also committed to serving victims of drug-impaired driving and to help advocate for evidence-based approaches to solving this problem.

Since 2019, Fundación MAPFRE has partnered with Mothers Against Drunk Driving, supporting their community and school-based educational programs for children, families, and the general public. With Fundación MAPFRE's support, MADD travels to community events such as health fairs, expos, school events and community days throughout Massachusetts and Connecticut.

In 2023, the Fundación MAPFRE and MADD partnership expanded to include the Power of ME Program. This new program focuses on alcohol use prevention and vehicle safety for 4th and 5th grade school students.







With Fundación MAPFRE's support, MADD has distributed **more than 1,500** safe riding cards to youth across CT and MA promoting the Power of Me (POM) Program and Fundación MAPFRE partnership. In 2023, MADD CT presented the first POM Program in the country through the support of Fundación MAPFRE.



MADD's Power of You(th) and SMART programs educate teens on the dangers of underage drinking and cannabis use. Throughout MADD and MAPFRE's relationship we have reached **almost 4,000 teens** through educational presentations.



Special events such as Walk Like MADD and our annual Law Enforcement Recognition Ceremony have showcased the partnership with Fundación MAPFRE.



A major focus of MADD's programming is outreach to communities through health fairs and virtual events. Since partnering with Fundación MAPFRE we have reached **more than 60,000 people in person** and over **350,000 through virtual communications.**

Best Buddies

Best Buddies supports secondary and postsecondary students with disabilities to be successful both in their transition from school to postsecondary education and on their path to their first job.

Access to the world of work continues to be a decisive factor in the economic imbalance between people with and without disabilities. Best Buddies International aims to change this inertia by cultivating the countless skills of people with disabilities and integrating them both into the community itself and into the workforce. The organization offers this support through educational and empowerment actions so that people with disabilities become leaders in their schools, communities and workplaces.

The Fundación MAPFRE and Best Buddies partnership began in 2019. The collaboration created the Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) Program. This program prepares young adults with IDD for independence and inclusion in their communities as they move from school into adulthood. Pre-ETS program combines classroom based training, experiential learning opportunities, and corporate mentorship to help students identify and develop career ambitions, explore postsecondary options, and prepare for independent living.

The Pre-ETS curriculum includes 70 unique lessons and over 150 hours of content supporting career readiness skills.



OneGoal

OneGoal is an organization that works with schools and districts to transform postsecondary support through their classroom-based model and OneGoal Leadership Network so that all students can define their futures.

The Fundación MAPFRE partnership with OneGoal supports the cohort of juniors, seniors and students in their first year of postsecondary education from Bartlett High School, Webster, Massachusetts.

All of the students from the Class of 2022 at Bartlett High School who participated in the OneGoal program enrolled at a postsecondary institution.

A total of 1,752 students have successfully participated in the OneGoal program.

Bottom Line partners with first-generation, degree-aspiring students from low-income backgrounds to get into college, graduate, and go far in life by establishing mobilizing careers.

Fundación MAPFRE's collaboration with Bottom Line supports the Young Men of Color Initiative. The YMOC initiative goal is to dramatically increase the number of young men of color it serves through its programs.

YMOC Initiative Outcomes

- **86%** of YMOC in our 2021–22 cohort are on track to graduate college within 6 years.
- **70%** of YMOC are on track to transition to our Success program.

Real Madrid Foundation Youth Social Sports Program

The Fundación MAPFRE and Real Madrid Foundation Youth Social Sports program partnership with Webster Public Schools started in 2020. The Real Madrid Foundation promotes an education in values through soccer and basketball and at the same time builds enthusiasm and passion for sports. The sports program fosters physical, intellectual, emotional and social development for mainly underserved children and youth and is a means of social inclusion.

The expected number of beneficiaries at Park Avenue Elementary School for this season 2023–2024 is **50 students**. Season 2022–2023 at Bartlett Middle School finished with a total of **29 beneficiaries**.
